Water conservation, let's make it a way of life.

DROUGHT ALERI

As we enter a third consecutive year of drought, our water sources have become critically low. We must act now to ensure our communities have enough water to maintain the health of its residents and its environment. The County of Los Angeles has issued water restrictions and is requesting all Los Angeles County Waterworks Districts customers to cut back their water usage.

In the previous 2015 drought, County of Los Angeles residents were able to cut back significantly in their water use, successfully mitigating the drought and cementing water conservation as a lasting way of life. The current drought is considerably more severe than the one in 2015, and additional water conservation efforts are needed.



- Outdoor watering prohibited between the hours of 10 am and 6 pm
- Street addresses ending in even numbers may water only on Tuesdays and Fridays
- Street addresses ending in odd numbers may water only on Mondays and Thursdays
- Commercial customers may water Mondays and Fridays

Legislation:

On 3/28/22 Governor Newsom signed Executive Order N-7-22, escalating prior water conservation efforts.

On 5/24/22 State Water Resource Control Board passed **Resolution** No. 2022-0018, requiring urban water suppliers to move to Level 2 of their Water Shortage Contingency Plans.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Can I water my vegetable gardens?

A: Watering of vegetable gardens is allowed. The use of water is not prohibited to the extent necessary to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings or to the extent necessary to address an immediate health and safety need.

Q: Can I provide water to livestock (horses or other animals)?

A: The District allows providing water to livestock without restriction. The use of water is not prohibited to the extent necessary to ensure the health of livestock or to address other immediate health and safety needs.

Q: Can I hand water my grass?

A: Outdoor hand watering is allowed on your watering days and limited to 10 minutes per zone/area. Hoses must have an automatic shut-off nozzle and water cannot run off from landscaped areas.

Q: Can I water my bushes/plants and trees?

A: Watering of plants and trees is allowed without restriction. The use of water is not prohibited to the extent necessary to ensure the health of trees and other perennial non-turf plantings or to the extent necessary to address an immediate health and safety need.


IRRIGATION CONTROLLER

- 1. Change your watering schedule as the season changes.
- 2. Remember to check irrigation systems for leaks and excess run off into the street.
- 3. The best time to water lawns is early mornings or late evenings.



BE A DROUGHT SUPERHERO

- Add an automatic shutoff nozzle to your hose
- Fix broken sprinkler heads and leaks
- Install drought-tolerant landscaping with drip irrigation
- Use a broom, not a hose, to clean hard outdoor surfaces
